

**GREENBURGH ELEVEN UFSD
POLICY #1925
INTERPRETERS FOR HEARING-IMPAIRED PARENTS**

The Board of Education of the Greenburgh Eleven UFSD recognizes that those parents/guardians of children in the Greenburgh Eleven community with hearing impairments which prevent meaningful participation in their child's educational program must be afforded an opportunity equal to that afforded other parents/guardians in meetings or activities pertaining to the academic and/or disciplinary aspects of their child's education. Therefore, pursuant to law, the District will provide an interpreter for hearing-impaired parents/guardians for school-initiated academics and/or disciplinary meetings or activities.

The District will provide an interpreter if a written request for the service has been submitted to and received by the District within five (5) days prior to the scheduled meeting or activity. If an interpreter is unavailable, the District will make other reasonable accommodations which are satisfactory to the parents/guardians. These services will be made available by the District at no cost to the parents/guardians, such as note-taker, transcript decoder or telecommunications device.

The Board directs the Superintendent to maintain a list of available interpreters and to develop procedures to notify parents/guardians of the availability of interpreter services, the time limitation for requesting these services, and of the requirement to make other reasonable accommodations satisfactory to the parents/guardians should an interpreter not be available.
